Sub-Concepts Covered: Perseverance, Kindness

Kindness in the Classroom lessons teach kindness skills through a step-by step framework of Inspire, Empower, Act, Reflect and Share. Each lesson starts with the 'share' step to reinforce learning from previous lessons. The 'act' piece is woven into the lessons but really takes place in the projects.

The Integrity Unit is our fourth unit in a series of six. It focuses primarily on giving students strategies to help them make honest choices and to persevere through challenging situations. We also talk a little bit about what a reputation is and how we can be people of good character and good reputation through the choices we make and actions we take. As with other units, we hope to connect the concepts in this unit back to kindness, which is integral throughout the series.

Unit Objective

Students will:

- Review the primary themes from previous units: caring, kindness, inclusiveness, and fairness.
- Define honesty, dishonesty, and reputation.
- Utilize caring and kindness to develop honest alternatives to deceptive actions.
- Identify strategies that help people persevere through challenges.
- Work as a team.

Student Introduction

Welcome to the Integrity Unit! Over the next few weeks, we are going to build some superpowers around integrity, which means we show others we know how to make good, honest choices and that we can work hard even if we are in a difficult situation! We will talk about real-life situations where we have choices to make and even play a game you might already be familiar with - Chutes and Ladders (with a twist!). We are going to focus on these important areas:

- Making honest choices!
- Working hard - persevering - through challenging situations!
- Showing respect to others by being truthful!
- Building good reputations through our kind words and behaviors!

Project 1 Recipe for Integrity	This project allows students to conceptualize integrity using a “recipe” as a way to explain it.
